


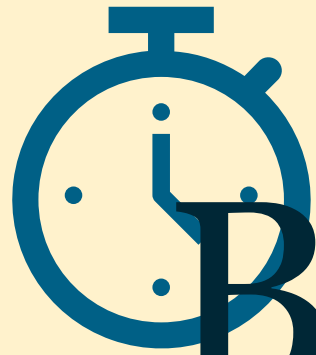
Words to live by

two in the bush

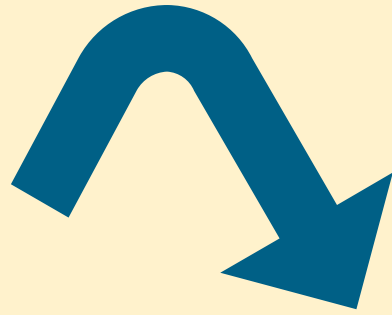
[Something you already have is better

begins at home 

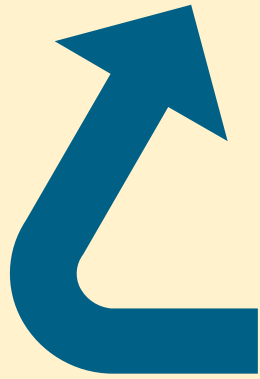
[One should take care of one's own

- citizen = he who lives in a city

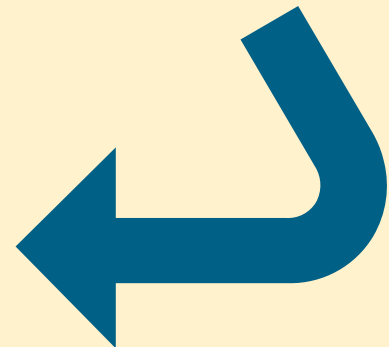


Haste
